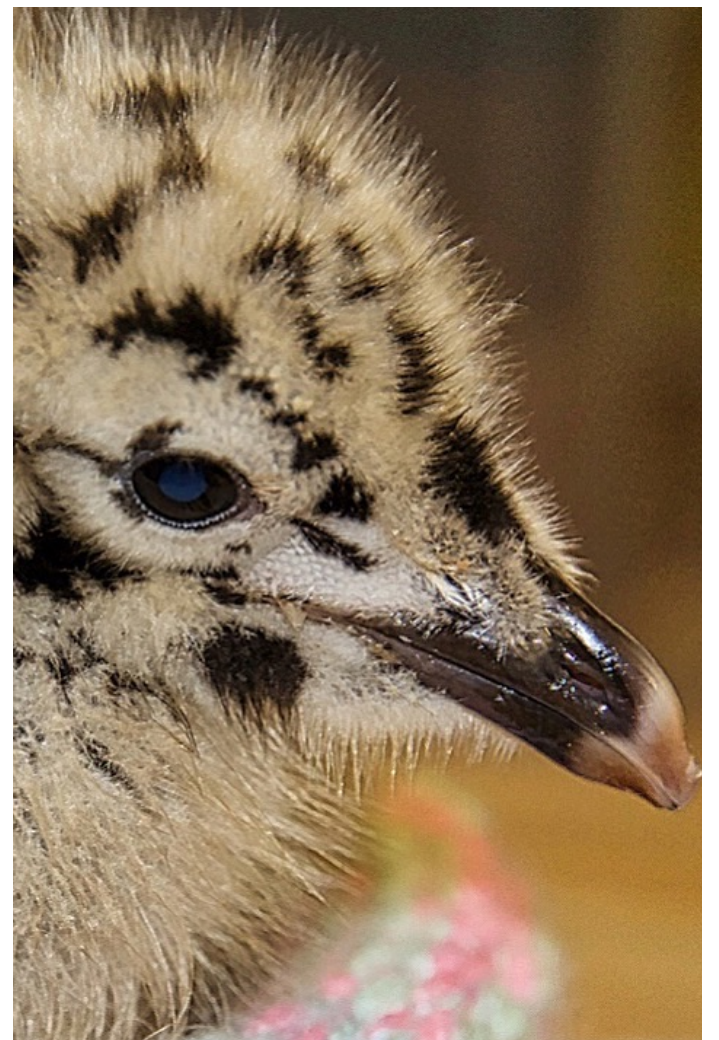




Found a barely feathered bird? A nestling needs parental care, has to be kept warm and brought to a specialised wildlife rescue, if it cannot be safely reunited with its family very soon.

Found a fully feathered baby bird? A healthy uninjured fledgling found by his or her own on the ground has not necessarily been abandoned, as the young of many bird species will spend a couple of days on the ground before they are able to fly properly. If necessary, move the bird to a safe spot and watch from a safe distance to make sure that the parents have returned and are feeding.

If in doubt, please contact an experienced wild bird rescue or rehabber and ask for advice.

When the bird is warm and secured, then please find as soon as possible a qualified rehabber, who can provide the correct environment and feed the rescued bird an appropriate diet.
